

1. European Forum for Automated Transport (EFAT) - Commitments

National Strategies:

• Countries are creating strategies and roadmaps for the safe and sustainable deployment of automated vehicles.

Best Practices:

Sharing best practices in national regulations helps integrate automated transport within mobility policies.

National Implications:

• Understanding the implications of automated vehicles on traffic enforcement, roadworthiness, infrastructure, driving licenses, and social acceptance is crucial.

Recommendations:

Coordinated actions and harmonized regulations are needed, including developing global technical frameworks.




2. Roadmap to Cross-Border and Multi-Member State ADS Deployment

- Step 1. Pre-Homologation ADS Testing → Guideline
- Step 2. Testing for ADS EU Type Approval in the case of Multi Member State ODDs → Update of the Interpretation document to the ADS Regulation EU 2022/1426
- Step 3. ADS cross-border and multi Member State deployment and scaling → Harmonisation of deployment requirements?



3. Large series & Global Harmonisation





EU Action Plan for AD: Flagship Actions



Testbeds for Autonomous Driving: The EU plans to establish at least three large-scale cross-border testbeds, regulatory sandboxes, and European Automated Driving Corridors to boost market readiness and commercialization.



Single Market for Autonomous Driving: The current regulatory environment is fragmented, and the EU aims to create a more harmonized framework to facilitate the deployment of autonomous vehicles.



Regulatory Framework Development: The Commission will prioritize developing regulations for autonomous vehicles, starting with automated parking systems in 2025 and expanding to more use cases in 2026. Harmonized approval procedures for ADAS and ADS testing will be proposed in early 2026.



Concluding remarks

- Automated and Driverless Vehicles approval already possible
- Guidance for harmonized implementation
- Aim at Global harmonisation by 2026
- Meanwhile gradually move to large series ADS approval by 2026 (APS first, 2025)
- European Forum for Automated Transport (EFAT) created to answer deployment related questions
- Automotive Action Plan: Flagship actions for ADS
